<u>Dealership Activities Update</u>: There was no activities update presented.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: Since our secretary had resigned, Chip asked if everyone reviewed the October minutes in the Newsletter. Chapter members responded to the affirmative, and Richard Dillon made a motion to accept the minutes. His motion was seconded and it passed unanimously.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Buddy Newman delivered the Treasury Report. He related the dues collected from new members, expenses paid since the last meeting, and advised the current account balance.

<u>Acting Director / Assistant Director's Report</u>: Chip reminded the Chapter that during the October meeting Richard Dillon made a motion

that was tabled for the Chapter to donate \$500.00 to "Wreaths Across America," and called on Richard to explain the motion again. Richard explained that "Wreaths-Across-America" was a non-profit organization, and that the funds would be used to purchase wreaths for the Louisiana Southeast Veterans Cemetery that opened in Slidell last July. Richard said that wreaths cost \$15.00 and that 177 veterans had been interred in the cemetery since it opened. He further explained that donations had to be turned in by 1 December and that if more donations were made than required for the number of veterans interred before Christmas that the money would be held until next year. Chip opened discussion and one of the members asked if a wreath would be placed on every grave. Richard said yes. Judy Anderson said that she did not believe the Chapter should make a donation if it could not purchase Christmas gifts for at least one child and that members should make personal donations. Carol Dussel said that since veterans gave their lives for us that we owed them, and that we should make the donation. Other members commented positively as well, and someone suggested Richard made the motion again. He did, and Carol Dussel seconded the motion which was passed unanimously.

Christmas Party Committee: Ray Gregg, the committee chairman reminded the Chapter that the party would be held at the Sunrise Bistro on 13 December, and that tickets cost \$15.00 for both members and their guests. He explained the theme this year is "south of the border," and that the committee needed volunteers, both men and women, to perform a dance routine for entertainment. He completed his report by reminding the Chapter we are obligated to pay for forty (40) meals and that only seven (7) members had purchased tickets to date. He asked that everyone purchase their tickets as soon as possible so we would know how many people are coming.

Since he had the floor, Ray proposed the Chapter purchase a new notebook PC. He explained the current PC runs on Microsoft XP and that the new version of Quickbooks the Chapter planned to use to manage finances would not run on XP. After discussing the matter, one of the members made a motion to purchase a new computer, not to exceed \$500. Richard Dillon seconded the motion which was unanimously approved.

<u>Membership Officer</u>: Frank Lay announced the birthdays for the month and advised advised that we don't have any new members to report. <u>Head Road</u> Captain: Simon Gonzales asked if anyone was interested in being a road caption to let him know. He then announced that the after meeting ride would be to Blue Hickory BBQ in Covington and that we'd be leaving about 15 minutes after the meeting.

**Editor:** Richard Dillon reminded everyone that if they have any input for the newsletter to email it to him by the 15<sup>th</sup> and to provide him the full names of everyone in any pictures from the left to the right.

Acting Activities Director: Richard Dillon asked the Chapter to let him know if they had anywhere specific they'd like to ride for lunch following the monthly meetings to let him know so he could add it to next year's event schedule.

# **Mad Santa Gift Exchange**

If you plan on attending the Northshore HOG Christmas Party and want to participate in the gift exchange, please do the following:

If you are a female attendee, bring a wrapped gift appropriate for a female. Male attendees should bring a wrapped gift appropriate for a male recipient. Please mark your gifts with the appropriate designation "male" or "female."

As each gift is received, a numbered ticket will be provided to the gift giver. When it comes time for the gifts to be distributed, corresponding tickets will be drawn at random. The holder of the first numbered ticket drawn will pick a gift from the male or female gift pool (depending on the gender of the ticket holder), unwrap it and display it for all to see what the gift is. Thereafter, the second ticket will be drawn. The holder of that ticket number will have the option of taking the first gift holder's prize or selecting an unwrapped gift from the pool for his/ her gender. After the recipient of this gift displays his or her prize, another ticket will be drawn and the corresponding ticket holder will have the option of taking either of the first two gifts or selecting a wrapped gift. This process will continue with the options of selecting a wrapped gift or an unwrapped gift. However, the third possessor of any gift gets to keep it.
