"It all started in January 2006. Ward mentioned to me at the January HOG meeting that he and Cary wanted to go to Sturgis this year. I have wanted to go for several years now but none of my previous attempts were successful because the people I planned to go with cancelled. I have been planning such a trip now for several years. I told Ward that we need to



make reservations now, in January, if we wanted to get the "good " spots. He told me that he had a friend (Ed) who has been to Sturgis several times and that he already had plans. ..."

Ward had a trailer that could handle 2 motorcycles. There were at least 3 of us going to Sturgis. How was that going to work? Ward said we could take turns riding motorcycles. Ok, we have a transportation plan but we still need to get an overall itinerary. We said we would get together to plan

things out but January, February, March and April passed and no further plans were made. Ward's work became very intense. Several large projects that I had at my work were delayed and were going to happen at the same time we were planning to go to Sturgis. Cary was having work issues as well. Because of my past experiences I was already thinking the trip was not going to happen this year as well. In May, Ward gave me a packet of info on Sturgis but no other planning happened. June passed.

In July, Ward told me of a general plan to stay in a campground outside of Sturgis but no details. Two weeks before we were to leave, Cary had to back-out of his plans to go to Sturgis"





In The Beginning - A Brief History Of H.O.G.

Terry Forrette - Historian

The year was 1983, just two years after the buy-back from AMF. Financially Harley Davidson was suffering. Faced with a large debt burden from the buy-back, low sales figures, a somewhat dissatisfied dealer network and a still suffering public image, the Harley Owners Group (H.O.G.) was created. The first appearance of H.O.G. was at Daytona Bike Week in March of 1983 that included a poorly attended bike show followed by a now infamous cocktail party (some things never change). However this event was followed that same year with several H.O.G. gettogethers around the country that eventually united the "family" of Harley Davidson owners into one group. Dues that first year were 30 dollars. First year membership was an astounding 30,000 members that grew to 63,000 in 34 chapters by 1985. H.O.G went overseas in 1991 with founding chapters formed in Germany, France, and England. 1992 saw the first European H.O.G. rally in Mulhouse, France. At present time there are over 650,000 members in 1,200 chapters based in 115 countries and dues have only increased to 40 dollars! chapters based in 115 countries and dues have only increased to 40 dollars!

H.O.G. became the first company sponsored motorcycle club and its immediate success can be attributed to those early members as well as sponsoring dealerships. Riders, both white and blue collar, who has always wanted to belong to a motorcycle "gang", could now experience the camaraderie of a motorcycle club.


