
Mike Werda, our Asst. Director, and Ray Gregg, our Activities Officer, were out to town. Ray has bike events posted on the Chapter web site calendar.

For Greg and myself, these semi-planned Wednesday rides offer a welcome break from the routine chores that retired guys end up doing — home maintenance, vehicle maintenance, laundry, yard work, caring for the pets, addressing medical issues, and keeping one's better half happy.

On the morning of May 12th, Greg, Pat, and I met at the Exxon Station located at the intersection of Gause Blvd. East and Military Road. Since I had not ridden my old (1993) Electra Glide Sport in over two months, I decided to put the old girl through her paces this day. The weather was perfect. The skies were clear with low humidity, and the temperatures hovered in the low seventies. Our route was planned on the spot.

We headed south on Military Road to Business Route 190, then east to US 90. Following the western shoreline of Lake Borgne, we motored northeast to Waveland, MS., then traveled north on MS 603 through Kiln. We continued on 603 over rolling hills and gentle curves to MS 53 north. Below cloudless skies, flat lands gave way to foot hills bordered by large palatial tracts of farmlands and mansion houses hued by the new green growth of spring. It truly was a perfect day.

At Poplarville, we turned east on MS 26 meandering our way on this well-maintained, but less frequently traveled two-lane for about 30 miles to Wiggins, MS., stopping at the Chevron Station to decide where we would end up for lunch.

After topping off our tanks and engaging in small talk with some of the locals at this pit stop, we decided we were in the mood for barbeque, and that the best place to get it would be "The Shed," located on MS 53 about 10 miles west of Lyman, just north of Gulfport.

From Wiggins, the three retired guys headed south on US 49 for 23 miles, then west on MS 53 to the agreed-upon eatery, where we enjoyed a sumptuous lunch of ribs, pulled pork, and brisket while listening to various artists playing the blues over The Shed's sound system. The food was phenomenal, the service was prompt and courteous, the portions were abundant, and the company was great.

After gorging ourselves, we departed via MS 53 west to MS 603 south, motored back though Kiln to the Interstate and home.

Altogether, we logged about 200 miles on this impromptu Wednesday trip. It was one of many that we retired guys have experienced on the spur of the moment. For you working stiffs, eat your heart out. For the rest of you, set time aside from your chores to enjoy the two-wheeled sport with your happily unemployed compatriots.
