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


A RIDING COMPANION'S PASSING

I ordered my first Harley, a 1993 FLHS (Electra Glide Sport) in June, 1992. It was delivered to the Brunswick, New York dealership (I was living near Albany at the time) on July 6, 1993. The long waiting period was occasioned by the fact that Milwaukee was only producing 80,000 units per year — far less than the demand back then.

Over the years, she was my faithful two-wheeled companion on countless short and long-distance adventures. One of the most memorable occurred in 2000, when my wife, Sissy, and I took an 18-day cross-country trip with "Flip" and Marie Young (old riding buds from Little Rock). We managed to travel through every state west of the Mississippi on mostly 2-lane roads — a total of 6,800 miles. A few of the more spectacular sights were the Pacific Coast Highway, the Redwood Forest, crossing the Narrows Bridge over the Columbia River from Oregon into Washington, Big Sky Montana, the Custer Game Trail, Yellowstone, and going over the continental divide from Yellowstone Lake to Cody Wyoming.

While I've owned other Harleys over the years, I could not part with my first ... until last month.

After paying my insurance bill, I noticed that I had ridden 'Old Red' only 750 miles last year. This meant it was costing me about 75 cents per mile for insurance alone! It was time to give her a new home. Two months after the bike was posted on the internet, she was purchased by an enthusiast in California. It was a sad day when they loader her onto a semi for her second trip to the west coast. She will be missed.


