2015 LOUISIANA HOG RALLY—WEST MONROE, LOUISIANA

The plan was to travel by back roads all the way to West Monroe to attend the Louisiana State HOG rally. As the day to leave drew near however, the weather was not working in our favor. 

Meeting called to order:9:45 amPledge of allegiance:Richard DillonInvocation:Carol Dussel

Secretary's Report: After opening the meeting Anna asked if everyone had read the minutes in the newsletter. Members responded to the affirmative and Richard Dillon made a motion for the minutes to be approved as published. Frank Lay seconded the motion, and the minutes were approved unanimously.

Assistant Director's Report: John reminded everyone that the Louisiana State Rally was this weekend, and that a group of members would be meeting at the RaceTrac Thursday for a 7:30 am departure. He said the group would be taking back roads to the rally and estimated it would take about six to seven hours.

Next he explained that the Chapter HOG merchandise will now be sold through the dealership's registers.

John also told the membership the Chapter will now include a classified section in the newsletter for members to advertise items they'd like to dispose of and / or services they provide. He said he would prefer to hire a fellow member to provide the services he needs versus hiring someone he doesn't know and that he would like to compile a list of the services provided by Chapter members. Treasurer's Report: Ray reported that last month the Chapter had a balance of \$6,088.00 and that an additional \$636.00 was collected during the month from membership renewals and sales of water and cotton candy at Bayou Thunder.

Ladies of Harley Report: Karl Fox presented the LOH report since Sonia had not yet arrived. He explained the LOH ride would be on April 18th to the Italian Grill in Picayune, Mississippi with a scheduled departure from Bruno's at 11:30. After Sonia arrived, she told the Chapter that the Lafayette Chapter was planning a ride on May 3rd to celebrate Women's Riders Month. She explained that riders from around the state plan to meet at Exit 122 (Boutte/LaRose) at 10:30 and that the ride will be to Pat's Waterfront Restaurant in Henderson, La. She said that everyone should plan to wear something pink, but that if you forget, the Lafayette Chapter will provide a pink bandana to wear. Please let Sonia know if you plan on going on the ride.

Membership Officer's Report: Frank called out the April birthday's: Ray Gregg and Bob Saenz.

Activities Officer/Editor's Report: Richard reminded everyone about the Talimena Rally on May 21-24 and asked that anyone planning to attend to sign up for the event so we can get a headcount of who is going.

Next he reminded everyone that the Chapter crawfish boil is May 31st and that the price is \$15.00 per person. He said that anyone planning to attend must pay by the May meeting so we can get a head-count to determine how many pounds of crawfish we'll need to buy.

Richard ended his presentation by telling the Chapter that Anna had asked him to publish the newsletter at least a week before the next meeting. He said that if he didn't receive information by the 15th of the month that it might not be published until the next newsletter.

Ray commented on how great our newsletter looks and thanked Richard for all the hard work he puts into putting it together. Richard thanked him for his comments and said he enjoyed putting it together.

Dealership Liaison: Lisa Marie thanked our members for all our help with Bayou Thunder. She said our cotton candy machine was a hit. She said she never realized how many people brought their families to Bayou Thunder and that she thought even more families might attend future events. She reminded us the Dealership is hosting a crawfish boil on April 11th.

Lisa said Elvis visited the dealership this past week and that it was really good to see him. She said he had to go in the following week to treat his cancer.

One of the members asked Lisa what the status was on the new construction. She said she thought the electrical concerns had been resolved and that the only concern left had to do with drainage. She explained how the dealership will be expanded in phases. She said a second floor is being added with a large Conference room the Chapter will be able to use for meetings.

Lastly, Lisa asked anyone that purchased a bike from the dealership to complete the online satisfaction survey. She emphasized the importance of the dealership receiving good scores and said the survey can even be completed using a smart phone.

Director's Report: Anna thanked everyone that helped with Bayou Thunder. She said that since most of us will either be at the Louisiana State Rally in Monroe, LA or Harley Owners Training (HOT) in Atlanta, GA, that Kyle Farley will represent the Chapter at the dealership crawfish boil.


